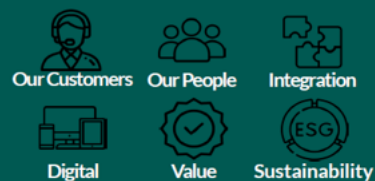

The Role

The primary role of the Digital Mapping Officer is to process map applications and updates for registration on the national land register, ensuring that recorded spatial data accurately reflects the legal interests acquired and protected through registration.

These roles report to, and supports, the Map Processing Manager/ Digital Mapping Manager in delivering high-quality mapping services. These services enable registration operations and align with the strategic objectives of T  .

The Digital Mapping Officer roles are varied and requires successful candidates to be adaptable, capable of working to targets, meeting tight deadlines, and consistently producing high-quality outputs. Comprehensive training will be provided to successful candidates on appointment.

Role Responsibilities

The role of Digital Mapping Officer includes, but is not limited to, the following duties:

- Completing digital mapping applications as part of the title registration process;
- Delivering high quality customer service to internal and external customers, while consistently setting a positive example within the team;
- Analysing and interpreting property registration data;
- Applying a sound working knowledge of best practices and registration procedures;
- Presenting written and oral material in a clear, concise and comprehensive manner to colleagues and customers;
- Sharing information, knowledge, and experience with colleagues to support team and organisational objectives;
- Applying quality-control procedures to all mapping functions;
- Identifying issues requiring escalation and providing clear, well-reasoned proposals;
- Achieving established performance targets;
- Supporting the implementation of new policies, initiatives, ideas, mapping systems, and training programmes to improve application processing times;
- Analysing, researching, and preparing responses to customer queries and correspondence;
- Assisting the senior team in planning, organising, and monitoring workloads;
- Preparing submissions and recommendations, contributing to more effective ways of working;
- Utilising Computer-Aided Design (CAD) technologies effectively;
- Conducting detailed research on matters relevant to T   Registration and analysing findings;
- Extracting bulk Spatial Data;
- Contributing to and completing project work, as required.

These roles of Digital Mapping Officer reports directly to the Map Processing Managers or Digital Mapping Managers.

Note: This job description is subject to re-definition as part of ongoing reforms within the Public Service and change management initiatives within TÉ.

Person Specification

On the closing date of Friday, 31st July 2026 **at 5pm** candidates must satisfy all the following requirements:

Essential Criteria:

- Demonstrate a strong record of achievement in their career to date; **and**
- The capacity to demonstrate to a high level the key competencies that have been devised for posts at this level under the following headings (see Appendix A for more details):
 1. People Management;
 2. Analysis & Decision Making;
 3. Delivery of Results;
 4. Interpersonal & Communication Skills;
 5. Specialist Knowledge, Expertise and Self Development;
 6. Drive & Commitment to Public Service Values.

Desirable Criteria:

- Demonstrate proficiency in Microsoft or equivalent, packages;
- Is competent in the use of digital mapping technology or Geographic Information System (GIS) packages;
- Hold a qualification in Mapping/Spatial Data or an equivalent qualification such as Geographic Information Systems (GIS), Geomatics, Geo-surveying, Geospatial Surveying, Engineering, Architecture, Spatial Data Management, Geography, Property Studies, and Information Technology IT.

Principal Conditions of Service (Please also refer to the Important Additional Information Document provided)

General

The appointment is on a probationary basis to a permanent post in the Civil Service and is subject to the Civil Service Regulations Acts 1956 to 2005, the Public Service Management (Recruitment and Appointments) Act 2004 and any other Act for the time being in force relating to the Civil Service.

The Grade Code for Digital Mapping Officer, Executive Officer (Standard Scale) is HRMS: CF3.

Personal Pension Contribution (PPC)

The PPC pay rate applies when the individual is required to pay a Personal Pension Contribution (otherwise known as a main scheme contribution) in accordance with the rules of their main/personal superannuation

scheme. This is different to a contribution in respect of membership of a Spouses' and Children's scheme, or the Additional Superannuation Contributions (ASC).

A different rate will apply where the appointee is not required to make a Personal Pension Contribution. Long service increments may be payable after 3 (LSI1) and 6 (LSI2) years satisfactory service at the maximum of the scale.

Important Note

Entry will be at the minimum of the scale, and the rate of remuneration will not be subject to negotiation and may be adjusted from time to time in line with Government pay policy. Different terms and conditions may apply if you are a currently serving civil or public servant.

Subject to satisfactory performance, increments may be payable in line with current Government Policy. Payment will be made weekly / fortnightly in arrears by Electronic Fund Transfer (EFT) into a bank account of your choice. Payment cannot be made until a bank account number and bank sort code has been supplied on appointment and statutory deductions from salary will be made as appropriate.

You will agree that any overpayment of salary, allowances, or expenses will be repaid by you in accordance with Circular 07/2018: Recovery of Salary, Allowances, and Expenses Overpayments made to Staff Members / Former Staff Members/Pensioners.

Tenure and Probation

The appointment is to a permanent position on a probationary contract in the Civil Service. The probationary contract will be for a period of one year from the date specified on the contract. During the period of your probationary contract, your performance will be subject to review by your manager(s) to determine whether you:

- (i) Have performed in a satisfactory manner;
- (ii) Have been satisfactory in general conduct;
- (iii) Are suitable from the point of view of health with particular regard to sick leave.

Prior to the completion of the probationary contract a decision will be made as to whether or not you will be retained pursuant to *Section 5A (2) Civil Service Regulation Acts 1956–2005*. This decision will be based on your performance assessed against the criteria set out in (i) to (iii) above. The detail of the probationary process will be explained to you by HR, and you will be given a copy of the Department of Public Expenditure and Reform's guidelines on probation.

All appointees will serve a one-year probationary period. If an appointee who fails to satisfy the conditions of probation has been a serving civil servant immediately prior to their appointment from this competition, the issue of reversion will normally arise. In the event of reversion, an officer will return to a vacancy at their former grade in their former Department.

In the following circumstances your contract may be extended and your probation period suspended.

- The probationary period stands suspended when an employee is absent due to Maternity or Adoptive Leave;
- In relation to an employee absent on Parental Leave or Carers Leave, the employer may require probation to be suspended if the absence is not considered to be consistent with the continuation of the probation; and
- Any other statutory provision providing that probation shall -
 - (i) stand suspended during an employee's absence from work, and
 - (ii) be completed by the employee on the employee's return from work after such absence.

Where probation is suspended the employer should notify the employee of the circumstances relating to the suspension.

Unfair Dismissals Acts 1977-2015

The Unfair Dismissals Acts 1977–2015 will not apply to the termination of this employment by reason only of the expiry of this probationary contract without it being renewed.

The Organisation of Working Time Act

The terms of the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997 will apply, where appropriate, to this employment.

Headquarters

Headquarters will be such as may be designated from time to time by the CEO. When required to travel on official duty the appointee will be paid appropriate travelling expenses and subsistence allowances, subject to normal civil service regulations.

Duties

The employee will be required to perform any duties appropriate to the position which may be assigned from time to time. The officer may not engage in private practice or be connected with any outside business which would interfere with the performance of official duties or conflict with his/her role.

Hours of attendance

Hours of attendance will be fixed from time to time but will amount to not less than 41 hours 15 minutes gross per week or 35 hours net per week. No additional payment will be made for extra attendance (over and above 41 hours and 15 minutes gross or 35 hours net per week) as the rate of remuneration payable covers any exceptional extra attendance liability that may arise from time to time.

TÉ offers flexible working, with a commitment to work-life balance and a family-friendly workplace.

Annual Leave

The annual leave allowance for this position is 23 days, rising to 24 days after 5 years' service, 25 days after 10 years' service, 26 days after 12 years' service, and 27 days after 14 years' service. This allowance is subject to the usual conditions regarding the granting of annual leave in the civil service, is based on a five-day week and is exclusive of the usual public holidays.

How to Apply

Candidates **must** submit:

Citizenship Requirements (Proof of Eligibility)

Eligible candidates must be:

- A citizen of the European Economic Area (EEA). The EEA consists of the Member States of the European Union, Iceland, Liechtenstein, and Norway; **or**
- A citizen of the United Kingdom (UK); **or**
- A citizen of Switzerland pursuant to the agreement between the EU and Switzerland on the free movement of persons; **or**
- A non-EEA citizen who has a stamp 4 permission¹ or a Stamp 5 permission.

¹ Please note that a 50 TEU permission, which is a replacement for Stamp 4EUFAM after Brexit, is acceptable as a Stamp 4 equivalent.

Competition Process

If the numbers applying are such that it would not be practical to interview all applicants, it may be decided to shortlist only those assessed as most suitable for the role based on the application submitted. In this case the selection board(s) will examine and assess the applications against pre-determined criteria. The assessment process may include one or more of the following:

- Shortlisting of candidates on the basis of the information contained in their application.
- Competitive preliminary interview.
- A final competitive interview.

At interview you will be required to provide specific and detailed examples of where you have demonstrated the skills and competencies required for this role. These skills and competencies will be thoroughly and systematically explored in order to determine suitability for the role. The interview board may ask you for additional examples.

Your application and performance at interview may also be considered in the context of assessing communication skills.

At all stages of the recruitment process, applicants will be notified of the outcome. Post-interview feedback will be provided, upon request, by the Resourcing Team. Candidates seeking clarification of decisions following shortlisting or post interview, regarding their candidature should direct their request to Resourcing@tailte.ie. This feedback will be managed appropriately as a standard part of the appointment process and does not require the initiation of any formal procedures.

General Information

This competition will be used to fill the post of Digital Mapping Officer in TÉ. Please note:

- Assignments are competitive and merit-based;
- The successful candidates can and will be assigned work in accordance with business demands;
- If shortlisting is required candidates will be assessed based on the evidence they provide, demonstrating the competencies required for the role. It is critically important that you give, specific and accurate examples of how you gained the experience and demonstrated the skills and experience required.

This competition will be held under the TÉ Recruitment Licence and in compliance with the Commission for Public Service Appointments (CPSA) Code of Practice – [CPSA - Code of Practice](#)

Conditions of Appointment

Appointment will be at the grade of Executive Officer, (Standard Scale) and subject to the usual conditions governing such appointments. On appointment, officers serve the first 12 months in an unestablished capacity i.e. probationary period.

Panel

A panel may be established from this competition and may be used to fill further Digital Mapping Officer positions that may arise across TÉ Locations. The panel will expire 12 months from the date of the first appointment under this competition unless permanently exhausted prior to that date.

Please note that all existing TÉ panels for the Digital Mapping Officer positions will be utilised as a priority before appointing successful candidates from this recruitment competition.

It should be noted that the filling of vacancies in TÉ is determined by the organisational requirements at the time a post is being filled and therefore, there is no guarantee that this panel will be fully utilised.

Appointment(s) will be offered, in order of merit.

The decision to accept or decline an offer must be made within 10 working days.

Officers must take up duty immediately or within an acceptable timeframe.
